



About the show: “Fun Between The Covers”



Type of comedy: Farce

Plot: Hope you're not disappointed, but the 'covers' referred to in the title are the covers of a book. This new farce introduces us to a husband and wife who own and operate a small-town bookstore somewhere in New England, the characters of the town, and a visiting celebrity author in town for a book signing. Sounds like a simple day, but all does not go well, and the shop and the town are in an uproar before all is straightened out.

Situations: A little romance, a little misunderstanding. Several of the characters become intoxicated without knowing it, by drinking a spiked punch.

Language: There is some wordplay that hints at sexual innuendo, and the occasional 'damn' 'hell' or 'crap.' If you have zero tolerance, this show is not for you; if you watch primetime television, you've probably heard lots worse before 8:30.

We think this play is suitable for: All audiences, except the extremely conservative.

We think you should avoid this play if: You have a problem with characters acting drunk. Or if you have no sense of humor at all...

If this were a movie, it would be rated: PG-13*
