



About the show: “Seasonal Allergies”



Type of comedy: Holiday Comedy

Plot: We’ve all done it: taken in a stray. In this case, a young couple invites a friend just getting over a bad breakup to Thanksgiving dinner. They make him at home, fuss over him, listen to his troubles and even offer to let him stay the night on the couch. They end the dinner feeling good, happy to have helped out a friend in need. The next thing you know, it’s Christmas and the friend hasn’t moved from the couch. Christmas dinner is a somewhat less festive occasion. And by New Year’s, it’s clear something has to be done!

Situations: Young people speak their mind about life, love and friendship. Nothing more than you’d hear at the table at your own holiday dinner.

Language: The characters include modern youth, and they get pretty worked up, so the odd cuss word will be heard. Moderate language: nothing extreme.

We think this play is suitable for: All audiences. Everyone who likes a comedy that recognizes that the holidays are a mixed bag, bringing joy and laughter as well as exhaustion and stressed relationships.

We think you should avoid this play if: ... You’ve never had a friend who overstayed his welcome, or if you don’t like the holidays. Otherwise, you’ll get two hours of terrific laughs out of this play.
